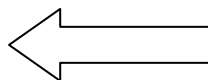


Punctuating for subordinating conjunctions (like *if*):

when/whenever
 even though
 although
 while
 if
 since
 before/after
 because



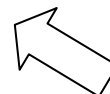
Here are seven examples of subordinating conjunctions.

Two choices: option 1

Complete sentence #1	A subordinating conjunction can go in between.	Complete sentence #2
----------------------	------------------------------------------------	----------------------

Two choices: option 2

A subordinating conjunction can also go in front.	Complete sentence #1	Complete sentence #2
---------------------------------------------------	----------------------	----------------------



Option 1 needs no commas at all; however, option 2 needs a comma here.

- You'll be a man someday if you can dream—and not make dreams your master.
- If you can make one heap of all your winnings, and risk it all on one turn of pitch-and-toss, then you'll be a man someday.
