Inspired by Robin Pulver's Punctuation Takes a Vacation

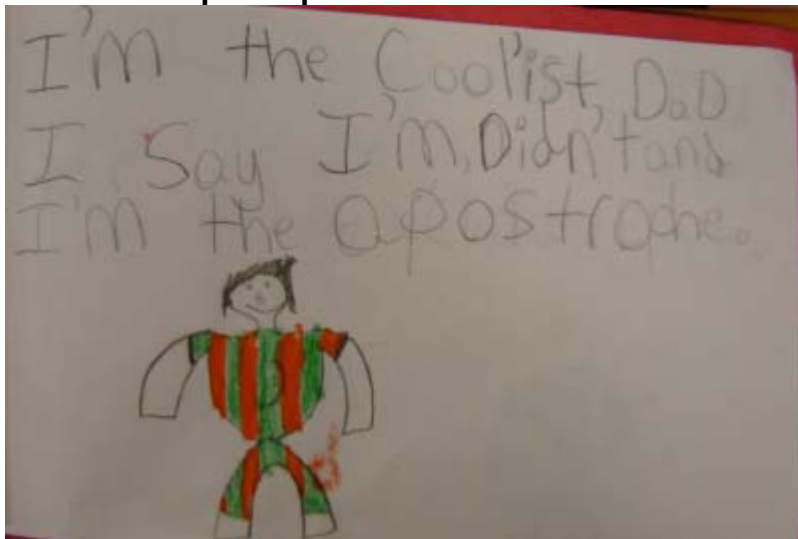
